

Canada Goose *Branta canadensis canadensis* (0, 1, 4). Statistics for wild / vagrant individuals only.

(Breeds Canada and northern USA. Race *B. c. parvipes* breeds West Alaska, east to Yukon Territory. Most winter, Washington and Oregon, some also north-east Texas. Introduced Western Europe).

1954

One: Downpatrick, County Down, 21st November (J. Kirk, C.D. Scotland, D. Wolsey). *Rutledge* 1955.

1985

"A flock of seven at Myroe levels, Lough Foyle (Londonderry) from 21st - 28th October (DA) were undoubtedly of wild origin though they were not assigned with certainty to a particular race. All seven were small and dark (smaller than both White-fronted and Pink-footed Geese with which they loosely associated) and are best treated as "small Canada's" as the taxonomy of this group is somewhat confusing and open to debate". *NIBRC* 1987. The IRBC in *Irish Birds* 10(3): 393. Have published these as Cackling Geese, yet the NIBRC have made no announcement or have published these as Cackling Geese.

1987

One: Lough Foyle, County Londonderry, 2nd November. Was presumed to be of feral origin. *NIBA* 1992. However, it was published in the main body of the report with no explanation of why it wasn't a wild individual. Given the date and location a wild individual must be strongly considered. We are not including it in our totals.

2010

One: Adult. Kinrush Airfield, Ardboe, County Tyrone, 23rd January, photographed (Derek Charles). *Charles and Crory* 2019.

One: Adult. Flatfields, Moira, County Antrim, 8th February - 13th March, photographed (Neal Warnock, Derek Charles *et al.*). *Charles and Crory* 2019.

One: Adult. Brankinstown Road, Aghagallon, 7th March - 15th March, photographed (Derek Charles *et al.*). *Charles and Crory* 2019.

Two: Adults. Belfast Lough RSPB Reserve, Belfast Harbour Estate, Belfast, County Down, 6th November, photographed (Tom Ennis, Ian Dickey). *Charles and Crory* 2019.

The 2010 Antrim records from Antrim and Tyrone involved the same individual. It associated with a flock of Whooper Swans *Cygnus cygnus*.

2017

Two: Most likely Canadensis. Roe Estuary, Lough Foyle, County Londonderry, 29th October, photographed (Derek Charles, Theo Campbell, Richard Smith). *Charles and Crory* 2019.

2020

One: Large individual. Mountnorris, County Armagh, 3rd January (Joe Devlin). Record not published. A wild individual must be considered for this bird. We include in our totals.

There are two unpublished records of Canada Goose seen in flight at the Copeland Bird Observatory, Copeland Islands, County Down with a single on 11th October 1975 and two 17th October 1983. Given the dates a wild individual must be considered.

Todd's Canada Goose *Branta canadensis interior* (0, 0, 1).

(Race *B. c. Interior* breeds north-east Canada from Hudson Bay east to Baffin Island, and north-west Greenland. Winters south-east USA).

2003

One. Myroe Levels, Lough Foyle, County Londonderry, 12th - 21st December (Anthony McGeehan *et al.*). *NIBA* 2006. It was also observed at nearby Carrowreagh, Lough Foyle, County Londonderry on 14th December (David Steele).

Cackling Goose *Branta hutchinsii hutchinsii* (0, 7, 1).

(Breeds Canada and Alaska. Winters western Canada, United States and northern Mexico).

1985

Seven: Myroe Levels, Lough Foyle, County Londonderry, 21st - 28th October (Dave Allen *et al.*). *Irish Birds* 10(3): 393.

This group was not assigned to a race and were recorded before Cackling Goose was split from Canada Goose (w.irbc.ie/announcements/announce43.php). *Irish Birds* 10(3): 393.

2007

One: Cackling (Richardson's Canada Goose) *Branta hutchinsii*, Kinnegar Shore, Belfast Lough, Holywood, County Down, 13th September, photographed (Derek Charles). *Milne & McAdams* 2009.

2008

One: Seen in flight. Bann Estuary, Coleraine, County Londonderry, 18th October (Matthew Tickner). *NIBA* 2008b.

NIBA 2008b states that "it may have been a wild bird" and it is unclear if the record was accepted. We are not including it in our totals.
